Open Syllables with the schwa Sound

An Open Syllable is a syllable that ends in one vowel. The sound of the vowel is the long sound. However, an Open I syllable in the middle of the word will often have the short /ɪ/ sound, because it is an unstressed syllable (*television, typical*).
