Silent E Syllables Featuring the Suffixes -ite and -ive

| In this lesson, all of the words end in a silent <i>e</i> , but only two words have the long vowel sound in the final syllable. | Wordsmith Words: |

| Words ending in the suffix –ite are pronounced /ĭt/. This is a suffix that forms nouns or adjectives (definite, opposite, favorite, infinite, composite). | 1 |
| Words ending in the suffix -ive are pronounced /ĭv/. This is an adjective-forming suffix (positive, effective, active, objective, extensive). | 3 |
