COVERS

R Controlled Syllables

These words share R Family Spellings: *er, ar, or*. The *or* and *ar* spell /er/, typically at the end of words. However, they prefer their "teenage" sounds (/ar/, /or/).

Base words ending in *-ct* are of Latin origin. The suffix *-or* is added to these words to mean a person who (*doctor, collector, inventor*).
