## R Controlled Syllables

These words share R Family Spellings: er, ar, or. The or and ar spell /er/, typically at the end of words. However, they prefer their "teenage" sounds (/ar/, /or/).
Base words ending in -ct are of Latin origin. The suffix -or is added to these words to mean a person who (doctor, collector, inventor).
