The Closed Syllable is one of the six syllable types. It consists of one vowel followed by one or more consonants. The vowel sound is short. A closed syllable may have Complex Ends (ending blends) and/or Complex Fronts (beginning blends). These sounds are blended for reading and segmented for spelling.
